



“HOW TO” RECYCLING INFORMATION

RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

Materials to be Commingled	What Do I Recycle?	Cleaning and Preparation	What <u>Can't</u> Be Recycled?
Glass	Bottles and Jars ONLY Clear & Colored	RINSE CLEAN	Windows, Mirrors, Light bulbs and Tubes, Pyres and Dishes, Drinking Glasses, Chemical Bottles, Medical Containers, Laboratory Glass
Aluminum	Cans ONLY	RINSE CLEAN, Flattening Optional	Foil and Bottle Caps
Tin & Steel Cans	Food Cans ONLY	RINSE CLEAN Flattening Optional	Cardboard Sides Juice Cans, Aerosol Cans, Paint Cans
Plastic	Milk, Soda, and Detergent Bottles, Other Bottles marked #1 PETE through #7	RINSE CLEAN	Styrofoam, Plastic Cups and Film, Hard Plastic (Toys, Pails, etc.) Medicine Bottles & Syringes, Plastic shopping bags (these bags can be taken to participating retailers for recycling, i.e: Walmart, grocery stores, etc.)

OTHER RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

Materials To Be Mixed	What Do I Recycle?	What <u>Can't</u> Be Recycled?
Newspapers, Magazines, Office Paper and Cardboard ONLY (cardboard boxes must be broken down)	Newspapers, Magazines, Cardboard Card Stock, Office Paper, Books, Envelopes, Paper, Aseptic packaging (Milk cartons) Other Examples: Brown Paper Tape, Computer Printouts, File Folders-Manila, Glued Pads, Tablets, Phone Books, Post-It Notes, and ANY Junk Mail	Bathroom Waste Paper(towels, toilet paper), Carbon Paper, Cellophane, Cloth, Cork, Foil, Polystyrene Styrofoam, anything Waxed, Candy Wrappers, Napkins, Paper Cups, Styrofoam Cups, Styrofoam or Paper Food Containers, Photographs, Fiberboard, Labels and Label Backings,

Items not listed shall be considered trash/garbage and disposed of in appropriate trash container.

Electronics may NOT be placed in trash or recycle dumpsters. If you need to dispose of electronics, please see “Misc. Trash & Recycle Information”.
