

## Voting Privileges

**College Student:** Students have the option of filling out an application to receive an absentee ballot while they are at college. This will eliminate the need to register at school. Stop in at the City Clerk's Office or request an absentee ballot online at [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov) before heading off to college. Students have to be registered and provide a copy of a Photo ID.

**Military Voter:** Military voters do not have to register to vote. They can go to [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov) and request an absentee ballot or complete a Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). The City Clerk's Office can help with issues that may occur. Please send an email to [wbclk@ci.west-bend.wi.us](mailto:wbclk@ci.west-bend.wi.us).

**U.S. Citizen living overseas:** Permanent overseas voters are only eligible to vote in elections that contain a federal office. Temporary overseas voters are City of West Bend residents who are temporarily living outside the United States with intent to return. Temporary overseas voters have regular voting privileges.

**Hospitalized:** If hospitalized within 7 days before an election, there are special provisions for voting absentee. Please contact the City Clerk's Office.

## Voter Registration

Online: You can register to vote online at [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov). If you have a valid State of Wisconsin Driver's License you will be able to complete the voter registration online. Follow the simple directions provided on the website.

By mail: You can obtain a voter registration form (EL-131) at the City Clerk's Office or online at <https://elections.wi.gov> in the search field type: EL131. Fill out the Voter Registration, sign and mail with Proof of Residence (POR). A list of acceptable POR can be found under the polling locations on the next page.

City Clerk's Office: You can register in person at the City Clerk's Office at 1115 S. Main Street, West Bend until 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before the election. Proof of Residence must be provided.

At the polling place on Election Day: You may also register and vote on Election Day. Proof of Residence is required.

## Find My Polling Place



Find your polling place on the MyVote website at [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov). On the website, click on Find My Polling Place and enter your address where you have lived for at least 10 days. The location of your polling place will be displayed.

### Proof of Residence (POR)

Must include voter's name and current residential address.

A State of Wisconsin Driver License or State ID Card.

A real estate tax bill for the current or preceding year.

Utility bill (gas, electric, telephone).

A bank or credit card statement.

A paycheck or paystub.

A check or other document issued by a unit of government.

## Absentee Voting

After you are registered to vote, you can "request" an absentee ballot. A Photo ID must be provided. An Application for an Absentee Ballot (EL-121) should be completed and returned to the City Clerk's Office either by mail, email or fax. A copy of a Photo ID must accompany your first application by mail. The online application can be found at [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov). This application will be emailed directly to the City Clerk's Office, if a copy of a Photo ID is provided. You may be asked to attach a scanned copy of a Photo ID. (Do not send personal photos.)

In-person absentee voting at the City Clerk's Office typically takes place for the 15 days before an election. The City Clerk's Office is open 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The number of days absentee voting will take place is dependent on the type of election.

Deadlines: Regular and Overseas voters may request an absentee ballot by mail until Thursday before an election at 5:00 p.m. Indefinitely Confined and Military voters may request an absentee ballot by mail until 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before an election.

In-person absentee voting at the City Clerk's Office will be conducted until 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before an election.

All absentee ballots must be received by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

No absentee ballots can be returned electronically.
